## Provincial Finals Format:

The SMFA has re-developed the format of Provincial Finals. The following information is important for all participants:

- **Junior and Intermediate level classes** will be held on **Thursday and Friday (May 30 - 31)**, with an evening Intermediate Grand Awards Competition and reception on Friday, May 31. Workshops will be offered in Junior and Intermediate disciplines where time permits.
- **Senior level classes** will be held on **Saturday (June 1)**, morning and afternoon with an evening Senior Grand Awards Competition and reception.
- Winners (all levels - junior, intermediate and senior level) are announced at the completion of each class, with presentation of awards at the evening Grand Awards Competition.
- At the conclusion of the final sessions of each discipline, the adjudicators will select competitors to advance to the Grand Awards Competition in all levels (**intermediate and senior levels only**). Competitors advancing to the Grand Awards Competition (one from each discipline), must choose from repertoire performed earlier that day. **There is a 10-minute time limit, which may necessitate an abridged version of their selection.** Junior level winners will be invited to perform/receive their awards at the Intermediate Grand Awards, **Intermediate Grand Award prizes of 1<sup>st</sup> Place (\$750), 2<sup>nd</sup> Place (\$500) and 3<sup>rd</sup> Place (\$300)** will be awarded. **Senior Grand Award prizes of 1<sup>st</sup> Place (\$1,000), 2<sup>nd</sup> Place (\$750), and (3<sup>rd</sup> Place) (\$500)** will be awarded.
- **National Level of Provincial Final classes** will be held on **Sunday (June 2) @ 9:00 am** with a reception and announcement of Team Saskatchewan.
