Cindy Hayward was recently honoured by the Rosetown & District Music Festival for her contributions behind the scenes at music festivals. Hayward has served as the festival organizing committee's adjudicator liaison for the past five years and found "a lovely bouquet" one day when she arrived at the office of Hayward Glass and More.

The Rosetown Music Festival Association's leaders hope to honour Hayward publicly, for her volunteer contributions, when they can. "We had intended to recognize her at the 2020 Carol Festival but,

when that was cancelled, we planned to do it at the 2021 Carol Festival," says President Felice Mourre. "Unfortunately, we must postpone it to yet another year."

Hayward sang in choirs through her school years, in the Rosetown Community Choir and with the local vocal trio Berny, Cindy and Brenda, then the New Edition Quartet. However, she never participated in a music festival in her youth because she didn't play an instrument. She lived in Swift Current until she was about 11 years old, when her family moved to Rosetown.

"I've always enjoyed the fact that Rosetown has been able to have music festivals and enjoyed watching the kids perform and see how much they improve from year to year," Hayward says. "That's fairly amazing, right? And the teachers do such a fabulous job instructing them and bringing out the best in them."

After she volunteered to help, Claire Seibold told her she'd "be perfect" as the adjudicator liaison. The role includes making sure that adjudicators receive all the information they need to do their job, to meet them when they arrive, "brief them on how our music festival works", inform them how to reach festival venues and ensure their rooms are booked. Hayward also helped in other ways, such as sitting in on meetings where they needed an unbiased person to just listen in, because she didn't have children or students taking part in the festival.

"It was a very satisfying job and it was always very busy at festival time," Hayward says.

Terry Ross - Saskatoon Music Festival



Terry is a valued member of our Saskatoon Board and most distinguished member of the Kiwanis Club of Saskatoon.
