

- Consider limiting children and other members of your household to only visiting outdoor recreational areas close to your home. This will help limit the number of people your family may come into contact with during the visit.
- Signage must be posted near recreational facility entrances and in shacks to caution about the risks of COVID-19, as well as educate users in following the guidelines. Signage should include the following reminders:
  - Individuals who are sick should stay home.
  - A physical distance of two metres must be maintained between people not from the same household.
  - Individuals should wash their hands before and after using parks and playgrounds.
  - Avoid overcrowding. Individual groups must not exceed the restrictions on public gatherings.
- Washroom facilities must have an increased cleaning and disinfecting schedule, ensuring soap and water or a hand sanitizer approved by Health Canada (DIN or NPN number) is available, as well as the proper disposal of paper hand towels.
- Garbage bins should be emptied frequently.



### Group and Individual Activities (Virtual Activities Only)

- All amateur, in-person events/performances/concerts/ competitions/ recitals/festivals/demonstrations of activities (including dance, band and choir) are not permitted, unless performed virtually.
- No in-venue audiences/spectators are permitted.
- Physical contact of any kind is prohibited.
- Maximum capacity is 30 for any building or facility, not including video staff, instructors and building staff.
- Entry and exit times must be pre-determined and scheduled. No group arrivals are permitted.
- Performers/dancers/choirs/singing groups/musicians, as well as film staff, adjudicators, directors, instructors, etc., must wear masks at all times.
- Videos must be recorded in the largest space possible to maintain maximum distance between participants.
- All organizers/participants/ videographers must self-monitor for symptoms and use the self-assessment tool at [saskatchewan.ca/COVID19](https://saskatchewan.ca/COVID19).
- Follow proper hand hygiene and coughing/sneezing etiquette:
  - Wash your hands frequently with soap and water. Scrub for 20 seconds.
  - If soap and water are not available, use hand sanitizer approved by Health Canada (DIN or NPN).
  - Avoid touching your face, mouth, nose and eyes.

- Cough/sneeze into the bend of your elbow and then wash your hands with soap and water.
- Attendee lists must be collected and kept for a minimum of 30 days. Contact details must include date, time, name, address and phone number or email address.
- Signs and warnings about the risk of COVID-19, including mandatory masks and frequent handwashing, must be posted. Commonly touched surfaces and shared equipment must be cleaned and disinfected after contact between individuals, even when not visibly soiled. Special attention should be paid to commonly touched surfaces, such as doorknobs, light switches, rails, etc. Please see the [Cleaning and Disinfection Guidelines](#) for more information.
- No food and beverage is permitted.
- Close drinking fountains. Water bottle filling stations are acceptable if appropriately and frequently sanitized.

### Musicians/Singing

- Solo vocalists may remove masks during virtual performances, provided:
  - The solo vocalist is facing away from the musician.
  - The solo vocalist remains behind a physical barrier that is large enough to prevent transmission of COVID-19. All backup singers/accompanying musicians must be a minimum of three metres away from that barrier and remain masked.
  - Five metres physical distance must be maintained between the singer and camera operator (if the camera equipment is being operated by staff during the performance).
  - Barriers must be disinfected between performances.
  - Solo vocalists must wear masks before and after their performances.
  - Multiple singers are not permitted unless they wear masks. This includes backup vocalists.
  - A single vocalist may be accompanied by musicians, who must remain masked (e.g. pianist, guitarist, etc.).

### Dance

- Dancers, instructors and the videographer must be masked and maintain a physical distance of three metres at all times.
- Groups of eight or less dancers (18 and under) may be in a space/room at the same time, and three metres physical distance must be maintained between each dancer.
