Welcome!

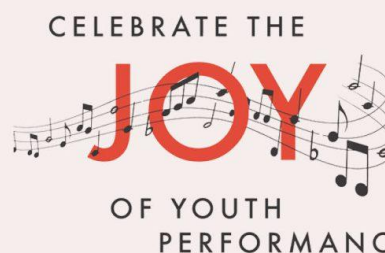
As hundreds of people from all around the province plan for 2025 music festivals, I hope for these things:

This scholarship is provided in memory of Regan Grant. Following graduation from MUCC, Regan earned a double Major in Voice and Drama in 1984 from the University of Regina. He spent time at the Banff School of Fine Arts and two summers in BC with the Canada Opera Picola. While working at the University Hospital in Saskatoon he performed with the Gateway Players and Persephone Theatre. Regan graduated in June 1988 with a Diploma in Operatic Performance. Regan was diagnosed in 1986 with HIV infection and battled through a number of illnesses associated with AIDS. He will be remembered for his warmth, humor and love for life and his generosity to friends and co-workers. Regan soldiered on courageously as his health continued to fail. He died peacefully at home on June 28, 1992.



#53 Verna Veikle Memorial Piano Concerto (17 years & under) Scholarship - \$300

Verna was born and grew up on a farm at Wilbert, Saskatchewan. Even as a young child Verna was drawn to music. She was ten when her father brought home a piano. This was the beginning of her life as a musician. By the time she was twelve she was teaching piano lessons for 25 cents per lesson. At sixteen Verna received her Associate in piano from the Royal Toronto Conservatory (She actually earned the certificate at fifteen, but the regulations stated you had to be sixteen to hold an ARCT.) She played for church, community events and, with her brothers, played music for local dances, sometimes for free, sometimes for \$5. In 1941 she moved to Saskatoon and continued her pursuit of music. She felt very fortunate to have the opportunity to study with Dr. Lyell Gustin. It was Dr. Gustin who opened the door to her playing for CBC radio. Verna was a very active performer and accompanist in the Saskatoon music community. In 1947 she married and moved back to the farming community of Wilbert. There she continued to teach, accompany, lead choirs and perform. Allison Cecilia Arends – Voice



Soprano Allison Cecilia Arends is noted for her “lyrical upper tones” and “empathetic acting” (Opera Canada), as well as voice that is “stunningly beautiful [and is] used with great sensitivity” (Hnatyshyn Foundation).

Allison is a graduate of Calgary Opera’s Emerging Artist Program and holds a Master of Music from the University of Toronto Opera School and a Bachelor of Music from the University of Victoria Voice Performance Program. Having performed across Canada, the United States, Germany, Austria, Italy, England, Israel, and China, she is an avid interpreter of opera, oratorio, chamber, and recital repertoire. Allison has performed most of the major Oratorio works with orchestras throughout Canada, has been engaged by various recital societies, and operatic roles of note include the title role in *Lucia di Lammermoor*, Gilda in *Rigoletto*, Violetta in *La Traviata*, Adina in *L’elisir d’amore*, both Adele and Rosalinda in *Die Fledermaus*, Musetta in *La Bohème*, Lauretta in *Gianni Schicchi*, Cleopatra in *Giulio Cesare*, and new compositions in productions with Soundstreams and Tapestry Opera. Allison toured with the Brahms Symphony Orchestra across China in a series of Viennese concerts, and was honoured to perform at Rideau Hall, as well as for International Dignitaries in Calgary and Toronto. She has been the recipient of numerous awards and grants, including the Hnatyshyn Foundation Artist’s Grant, a Metropolitan Opera Encouragement Award, a B.C Arts Council Senior Award, and prizes through the Spazio Musica opera competition in Italy, the Barrie Alexander international voice competition, and the Joy in Singing art song competition in New York, among others.

In addition to her performing, Allison has maintained a busy private voice and music theory studio in Toronto for almost 20 years, where she takes a great deal of joy in imparting her musical knowledge to students from various musical backgrounds of all age groups. Her students have been accepted into many prestigious programs in Canada, the States, and Europe, and regularly perform locally and abroad. Allison is a voice examiner for the Royal Conservatory of Music and regularly adjudicates music festivals from coast to coast. Having formerly taught for St. Michael’s Choir School, Timothy Eaton Memorial’s Choir School, and as a teacher and clinician for Vox Choirs, Toronto Concert Choir, and Cantabile Chamber Singers, Allison has conducted choral, vocal, and educational workshops and masterclasses for the Edna Manley Music College in Jamaica, University of Mississippi, British Columbia Provincial Music Festival, Regina Conservatory of Music, Ryerson Oakham House Choir, Opera Atelier, and the Royal Canadian College of Organists, among others. Allison was thrilled to combine her passion for teaching, children, music, and social justice by co-founding and running a music camp for underprivileged children in Kingston, Jamaica with her friend and colleague, Jamaican-Canadian tenor, Paul Williamson.

Joan Barrett – Strings, Guitar

Canadian violinist Joan Barrett has a wealth of experience as performer, teacher, adjudicator and coach. Her performing experience includes chamber music, solo recitals and performances with orchestra in addition to serving as Principal, Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, Assistant Concert Master, Stratford Festival Orchestra, and member of Kensington Sinfonia.

Prior to leaving Calgary for Toronto, Joan Barrett was deeply involved in the founding of the Academy program at MRU's Conservatory where she taught violin, chamber music and conducted one of the orchestras. A recipient of Mount Royal University's Distinguished Teaching Award, her students have been competition winners at the national level and are active professionally.



Raised in Ontario and furthering her education at Indiana University, Joan Barrett is grateful to have been taught and mentored by outstanding teachers and musicians such as Josef Gingold, David Zafer, Paul Rolland, and Ruggiero Ricci. Subsequently she has been influenced by the work of Moshe Feldenkrais, M.F. Alexander, and Association for Body Mapping Education.

A passionate educator, Ms. Barrett has taught at the University of Calgary, University of Toronto, The Royal Conservatory of Music, as well as being the first String Co-ordinator of its Young Artists Performance Academy. In 2012 she was the Artistic Consultant in the creation of nine recordings to accompany The Royal Conservatory's new Violin Series publications.

An accredited professional coach (OISE/Adler), Joan Barrett also has a successful coaching practice working with leaders, professionals in the arts and students to address challenges with performing, and career and life transitions. She currently teaches and coaches privately in Calgary, and leads professional development programs for teachers and performers.

Michael Oike – Piano



Pianist Michael Oike enjoys a busy and diverse musical life in his hometown of Winnipeg, Manitoba. For over 30 years he has taught piano to students of all ages, given workshops and masterclasses, and adjudicated at music festivals all across Canada. Michael performs in chamber music ensembles and as vocal and instrumental pianist.

Michael's training includes solo piano studies with Alice Nakauchi & Sydney McInnis, in Toronto with Boris Lysenko where he received the University of Toronto Forsythe Scholarship as the outstanding graduating pianist. In addition, Michael was fortunate to work with the renowned pedagogue Jeaneane Dowis at her New York studio and twice as a chamber

music fellow at the Waterloo Festival (Princeton University), and seminars with Rudolf Jansen and Martin Isepp (Aldeburgh School in England and Academy of Singing at Banff), two of the leading pianists in the field of vocal accompanying.

Away from music Michael enjoys golfing, curling, biking, cheering for the Jets, Raiders and Blue Jays, and tinkering in the kitchen perfecting his blueberry pies, butter tarts and sushi.

Susan Duska – Spoken Word

Susan Duska has wide experience in all areas of theatre, performance, vocal coaching and teaching.

She is on faculty at the Mount Royal University Conservatory and maintains a busy schedule teaching private and group lessons, as well as theory classes and adjudicating across the country. In addition, she coordinates Presentation MRC, a non-competitive speech festival for Calgary speech students.

Most recently, she has become an Artist Educator with Learning Through the Arts - an international program through the Royal Conservatory of Music - using speech and drama to teach curriculum in Calgary schools.



She holds a BFA. in Drama from the University of Calgary, is an Associate of the Royal Conservatory of Toronto as well as an Associate and Licentiate of the Mount Royal University Conservatory.

Darryl Ferguson – Brass, Woodwinds, Percussion



Darryl Ferguson holds a Bachelor of Music (Applied Trumpet) from Brandon University, a Master of Music (Trumpet Performance) from the University of South Florida, and a Bachelor of Education (After Degree) from the University of Manitoba. He teaches at Acadia Junior High School in Winnipeg, MB, where he directs four concert bands and a jazz ensemble.

Under his leadership, the Acadia band program consistently earns superior ratings and recognition at festivals across western Canada and the northern United States. The program has received the George Douglas Award from the Winnipeg International Optimist Concert Band Festival and, in 2014, became the first junior high to receive the Optimist Festival's Jazz Award. In 2011, Acadia's grade 9 ensembles were nationally recognized with the Robert Rosevear Award for most outstanding junior high concert band and the Don Wright Award for most outstanding junior high jazz band by the Canadian Music Educators' Association.

Darryl co-directs MusicFest Canada's Soho Sound Canadian Junior Honour Band, an initiative for outstanding young musicians across Canada. In 2021, he received the Manitoba Band Association's Award of Distinction for his contribution to music education, and in 2018, the Fort Richmond MLA Community Hero Certificate for community service.

As a trumpet player, Darryl has studied with Henry Christian, Alan Ehnes, and Jay Coble, and worked with Vincent Cichowicz, Don Owens, Larry Knopp, James Thompson, Laurie Frink, John McNeil, and Ray Sasaki. He has performed with the Winnipeg Wind Ensemble, Winnipeg Brass Quintet, Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, National Youth Orchestra of Canada, and Cambridge Brass Quintet.

Darryl is active as an adjudicator, guest conductor, clinician, and freelance trumpet player. He teaches applied trumpet at Canadian Mennonite University, conducts the Rupertsland Brass Band, and has completed Level One of the Canadian Wind Conductors Development Program. His students consistently excel in local and international competitions.

Jamie Hillman – Choir

Jamie Hillman is a Canadian and American musician, active as a conductor, singer, pianist, music educator, and composer-arranger. He holds the Elmer Iseler Chair in Conducting at the University of Toronto, where he is Director of Choral Studies and an Associate Professor. He conducts the U of T MacMillan Singers, leads the graduate choral conducting programs, and is adjunct faculty in Emmanuel College's Master of Sacred Music program. In 2024, he received the Faculty of Music's Teaching Award. Since 2022, he has also served as Associate Conductor and Director of Community Engagement of the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir.



Dr. Hillman has taught at Boston University Tanglewood Institute, Longy School of Music of Bard College, and the Kodály Music Institute. As a Boston University Prison Arts Scholar, he co-initiated a vocal music program in the Massachusetts prison system. He has adjudicated, conducted, performed, and presented across North America, and in Brazil, France, Greece, India, Indonesia, Portugal, and Taiwan. He has led All-State and festival choirs across numerous provinces and states, conducted at Carnegie Hall, and will conduct at Vancouver's Orpheum Theatre in 2026. He has premiered works by Shireen Abu Khader, Matthew Emery, Sarah Quartel, and Marie-Claire Saindon.

He has adjudicated for national and international organizations including the ACDA Pearl Prize, Alberta Music Festival Association, and the Ontario Arts Council, and presented at conferences such as the World Choral Expo and Music Educators Associations across North America. As a tenor soloist, he has sung major works by Beethoven, Handel, Mozart, Dett, and others, and performed with leading Canadian and U.S. choirs.

Hillman curates the Jamie Hillman Choral Series and co-edits for Earthsongs, Hinshaw Music, and Beckenhurst Press. He holds degrees from Western University, University of Illinois, and Boston University, and was the 2012 laureate of the Leslie Bell Prize for Choral Conducting.

Darnell Thomas – Musical Theatre



Canadian-born, with Trinidadian roots, Darnell Thomas is a passionate and versatile vocalist, multi-instrumentalist, educator, entrepreneur, and philanthropist. He possesses the versatility to sing and play several genres including but not limited to Musical Theatre, Jazz, R&B, Soul, Funk, Pop, Rock, Classical and Latin.

Darnell currently holds a master's degree in Vocal Performance & Ethnomusicology from York University. He recently joined Sheridan College as a full-time Vocal Professor in the Music Theatre Program. He is a holistic educator who strives to inspire, motivate and teach young aspiring performers of all disciplines to be their best. As an educator with extensive knowledge of performing arts pedagogy, he has also been involved in mentorship and curriculum and program development at many schools including York University, Sheridan College and St. Elizabeth Catholic High School RAP Program. He regularly participates in education workshops in New York City, led by established Broadway directors, artists and performers. He has received tutelage from some of the world's renowned voice teachers like Seth Riggs (SLS Creator).

Professionally, Darnell has done musical work for hit TV shows like *Glee* and Disney's *Overruled!*. He has produced, directed, written and performed in numerous musicals and songs featured in films and TV shows. Select music directorial credits include *Little Shop of Horrors*, *Hairspray*, *Footloose*, *Beauty & The Beast*, *Urinetown*, *Enchanting* and *Mamma Mia*. As an entrepreneur, he co-founded The Institute for the Performing Arts, Cue The Lights Productions, Vocalics Music Group, D & The Groove Factory all housed under his holding company, TDM Creative Group. His philanthropic initiatives include several years of work with UNESCO (an arm of the United Nations), the Arts Access Fund and his own foundation, Keys to Dreams Foundation, which provides financial assistance through scholarships to performers. He is also a member of National Association of Teachers of Singing, Musical Theatre Educators' Alliance and ACTRA RACS.

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
